Copies of the references read above are furnished herewith.

All the District Vocational Educational Officers in the State are hereby
informed that as per the Minutes of the Meeting referred to at reference 1st read
above, the Intermediate Education Vocational Passouts should undergo One
year Clinical Training in any Government Teaching Hospital or District Hospital
and the fee per candidate is fixed as Rs. 1,000/- [Rupees One Thousand Only].

The DME in its letter 2nd read above have furnished the list of Teaching
Hospitals duly indicating the number of Vocational candidates to be taken by
each Government Hospital in two Para Medical Courses i.e., DMLT &
Radiology.

Regarding Diploma in Ophthalmic Assistant and Physiotherapy courses, the DME in its proceedings 3rd read above have addressed all the Superintendents of Teaching Hospitals with a request to fix up the number of candidates to be taken by them in the said courses.

The APVVP in its letter 4th read above have also furnished the list of District Hospitals and Area Hospitals under their control with bed strength for taking further necessary action in the Clinical Training for the Intermediate Vocational Passouts.

Keeping in view of the information received in the references 1st to 4th read above, a "PRESS RELEASE" was given in the reference 5th read above, calling for the applications from Intermediate Education Vocational MLT, MPHW [F], X-Ray Tech., Physiotherapy and Ophthalmic Assistant students who passed after March 1990 onwards in the prescribed format with instruction to send the application to the concerned District Vocational Educational Officers by certificate of posting on or before 15.04.2004.

In view of the above, all the District Vocational Educational Officers in the State are requested to screen the applications received from the candidates, (selection for the training shall be made on priority basis) based on year of pass out Intermediate i.e., March 1990 and merit and allot them to the training institutions [in Teaching / District Hospitals] as per the strength communicated by DME & APVVP, Hyderabad. The list of Institutions [Training Hospitals] and capacity for training sent by DME is herewith furnished for information and necessary action.

The receipt of these proceedings should be acknowledged.

Sub: CFW - Functioning of Intermediate Vocational Training Institutions – Organizing Para Medical / MPH/W (F) Vocational Trainings – Board of Intermediate Education – Issuing of Guidelines / Policy decision on certain issues – Requested – Regarding.

It is to inform that the ANM / (MP:HW (F) plays a vital role in the Rural Health care delivery system and she is accountable to meet the health needs of the community. She should be able to provide accessible, equitable, affordable and quality health care. ANM can act as a catalyst for promoting inter-sectoral convergence in promotive and preventive health care.

ANM curriculum intends to prepare skilled and effective Female Health Workers to achieve the goals of National Rural Health Mission. ANM / FHW in Community Health skills to practice basic health care at a defined level of proficiency in accordance with local conditions and to meet local needs.

Intermediate vocational Training Courses - Preamble

In this regard it is to inform that the Board of Intermediate Education as a part of Education policy introduced Vocational training courses in 1980 and started number of paramedical / Midwifery courses without the concurrence of Health & Medical department. The technical courses that were initiated by the Education department is lacking in providing and conducting hospital based practical trainings and created lot of confusion in the department.

In this connection the following technical issues are brought to the notice of the Government for taking policy decision and issuing of necessary orders:

5 It is to submit that several meetings were held in the Government as per request by the Commissioner, Board of Intermediate Education to streamline the Intermediate Vocational Health Courses with the Health department.

6 The Board of Intermediate Education has started and according permission to number of private colleges for establishment of paramedical and ANM training colleges without concurrence of Health department without verifying the availability of hospital facilities or fixing the responsibility on the private institutions.

7 All the Health related trainings needs hospital attachment and they are hospital based trainings. While according permission the Board of Intermediate Education and the Training Institutions are not showing the hospital attachment. There are 220 MPHWS (F) Vocational Institutions in 2008. Now the department informed that there are 450 institutions.

8 The ANM training course is a residential training programme and hostel facility is an essential as per norms of the Nursing Council. Intermediate vocational MPHWS (F) course is not a residential course.

9 The ANM training institutions, Paramedical institutions under HM&FW dept are been governed by the nursing council and the Para Medical Board.

10 The ANM / Para medical course has to follow fixed curriculum and guidelines and the attached hospitals must have all the facilities to provide proper training. As per norms one training institution has to be attached to one hospital only.

11 The Board of Intermediate education has not addressing the technical issues (Practical component) while conducting the vocational courses.

MPHWS (F) trainees cannot be attached only to PHC for total 18 months training period to learn the entire course (PHC allotments = 3 months only).

Lab Technicians cannot be attached to Area Hospital / PHC's / CHC where only limited tests are being conducted.

Highly technical courses like ophthalmology / Physiotherapy courses has to be discontinued because it is not possible to provide proper training in the vocational institution

12 The Hon'ble court has given directions that after one year clinical apprenticeship the Intermediate Vocational candidates can compete for posts under Medical and Health Department.

13 There are 294 ANM training institutions, 300 General Nursing, 400 paramedical schools under HM &FW department.

14 The HM&FW Department has stopped according permission to new MPHWS (F) schools but the Board of Intermediate Education have been according permission, every year about 50-100 schools the strength of students in new schools is 3 - 10.

15 In this connection the Board of Intermediate Education organized a review meeting and minutes were communicated to the department, but the Govt has not issued any guidelines in this regard.

16 In this regard the Board of Intermediate Education pursuing on the following issues, so that the candidates are eligible for the posts under HM&FW dept without clinical apprenticeship (as there are limited seats for apprenticeship sponsored by Government of India). (Copy enclosed)

The proposals of the Board are:

1. To organize short term training in the hospital for all passouts.
2. To attach all Government and private intermediate vocational schools to Government institutions (DME/ DH/PHC's/ CHC/Area hospitals etc).
3. All students admitted to Para Medical Courses, henceforth may be given permission for
 - a. Clinical Attachment " for practical training and for On the job training (OJT) during the course period
 - b. Clinical Training" The Pass-outs of Para Medical Courses may be given permission for clinical training for 3 to 6 months. The duration of clinical training (i.e. 3 or 6 months may be please be specified to issue order at their end.

17 In response to the request of Board of Intermediate Education the APVVP, DME has accorded permission to the Intermediate Vocational schools without referring the matter to the Govt. The APVVP / DME have to obtain permission from Govt before giving permission to Board of Intermediate Education as it is a policy matter. (Copy enclosed).


18 All para medical courses are functioning under paramedical council / Nursing courses are under nursing council. It is essential to bring the Intermediate Vocational courses also under the control of above councils.

19 In view of above issues the Government is requested to review with the concern Officials of HM&FW and Board of Intermediate Education and to take policy decision and requested to issue necessary orders for proper conduct of Para Medical and Midwifery training courses.
